The 18-24 month old class saw a win and People's Choice for Boldview Farms with Boldview Starbuck Macchiato. Boldview Farms also had a win in the 8 year old and over class with Boldview Bonaparte Spect.

In the 2 year old class Jake Mathews owned Boldview Billi-Zad achieved Runner Up, while the syndicate of Ben Taylor, Ben Hentschke and Caitlin Liebich received 2nd Runner Up with Boldview Gibbs Patron in the 3 year old class. Paul and Vicky Timbs had success with Mayfield Farms Shimitan placing 2nd Runner up in the 4 year old Class. The 6 & 7 year old class saw Boldview Modem Pastel, owned by Mick and Janine Eagles also placing 2nd Runner Up.

The 3 day event will include talks on skeletal structure, microphone technique, ring craft, judges responsibilities promoting the dairy industry, and show ethics and rules. The Friday night will hold a sit down dinner, including a Breed Forum with an open Panel discussion. Saturday and Sunday will include farm visits looking at groups of cows/heifers, and cows and heifers being led and semi presented for judging, and oral presentation for any participants looking for breed panel judges recognition.

There will be presentations and tutoring from industry leaders including Patrick Nicholson, Cameron Yarnold, Brian Wilson, Richard Cole and Phillip Hentschke.
